
Book Review: The Starfleet Survival Guide

Hey everyone! This is Kyle Mills here and I am going to be reviewing a book for you today called "Star Trek: The Starfleet Survival Guide." Let's just put it simple. This is a book that every Star Trek simmer should have! I don't care what department you work in or what rank you are, this is just one of those need-to-have books, written by David Mack, a fairly common author in the Star Trek world, but even more so in the general Sci-Fi franchise.

Now lets move on to the book. It is broken up into 4 sections. They are Standard-Issue Equipment: Nonstandard Uses, Unconventional Medicine, Dangerous Life-Forms, and Extreme Scenarios. Personally, I think the "Extreme Scenarios" section is the most interesting, with topics like "Escaping from a malfunctioning holodeck" and "Detecting cloaked objects and vessels at close and intermediate ranges." This book has detailed explanations and step-bystep instructions for almost any emergency situation! Let's just put it this way, they are detailed enough to make your Commanding Officer be in awe. Perhaps your promotion is sooner than you thought, eh?

Though my favorite section is "Extreme Scenarios," the other sections are interesting too. Trek Tech 101: Ablative Armor

Have you ever wondered what it is that makes such starships as the USS Enterprise-E, USS Defiant, and the prototype USS Prometheus ('Message in a Bottle' from VOY), so resistant to hull damage under extreme stress and enemy fire power? Their amazing victories and returns from what would have surely destroyed lesser starships, is due in great part to the *ablative armor* on their hulls. The ablative armor prevents the ship's hull from evaporation, lessening the likelihood of a breech by an approximate 48.3 percent. While this does make it unlikely that damage so severe will occur, it should be noted that the starships that are currently equipped with the Armor are not impervious to damage or even complete destruction, though the latter is, again, a highly unlikely event to occur with the armor in complete working order.

The applications for this type of armor are proving to be many. Though no current prototypes exist, scientists both of Starfleet and of the private sector have been working many long hours in an attempt to make a shuttle craft enforced with ablative armor. If they are successful, the shuttle craft could possibly be made to withstand even the most vigorous attack. It has also been going around in the scientific community that scientists are working on light weight body armor. It's said it would give protection against phaser blasts and also prevent internal damage should a person find themselves in a fight with a particularly brutal opponent. As for Starfleet application of the armor, security teams will be issued with them and away teams visiting hostile or unexplored planets. Quite possibly heads of state will also be issued the armor once it is past prototype stage.

Should this technology come to fruition it will prove invaluable in saving many lives and may, if scientists are able to make it thin and yet still resistant to damage, become standard issue for all Starfleet personal as part of their uniform, if not the uniform itself.


Pointy-Eared Lover


Mr Not-To-Proud-To-Ask-For-Help.

Attention all commanding officers:

In recent months, Intelligence has been observing a marked rise in piracy in the vicinity of the Dar'essa System, known to some as the "Trader's Loop." While it has been known for some time that this area is something of a haven for smugglers and pirates, the region (almost a quarter of a sector) is largely uncharted and rarely patrolled. Normally, shipping losses in the area are minor and very rarely are one type of vessel targeted. However, the attacks of late have been targeting Federation-flagged ships and have become increasingly attributed to a single captain, one Jonas "The Rogue" McHogue. Many attempts have been made to apprehend this man, but none have thus far succeeded.

Little is known about this man, other than that he was born to merchant parents in the Rigel system. For a time, he commanded the merchant ship Avarice, but approximately five years ago began smuggling Romulan Ale on the frontier. Since then, he appears to have recruited a rather sizable crew and at least two vessels. His ship of choice seems to be a Maquis raider which he calls the Firestorm, capable of giving a Defiant-class destroyer a decent fight. He works in conjunction with an Antares-class freighter, the Jewel, which has been outfitted with strong shields and extremely quick impulse engines.

Early last month, the cadets of Starfleet Academy came close to recapturing the pirate, but failed when he stunned two of them and escaped into orbit. Before doing so, however, he was able to steal a partial list of the Fleet's transponder codes. It is currently unknown which ships' codes he has in his possession, but Starfleet Command is hereby warning all commanding officers that there is the chance that their ship or station may be in danger. Already the USS Hermes has felt McHogue's sting after they picked him up posing as one Captain Jason Monarch. He disabled a security guard and stole one of the ship's shuttle-craft, disappearing into a nearby asteroid field to evade recapture.

McHogue is wanted in no less than ten Federation and four non-Federation systems for crimes ranging from outright piracy to bribery, extortion, smuggling and gunrunning. There is some speculation that he is beginning to move his operations closer to the interior of Federation space. All Starfleet officers are ordered to keep a lookout for this man and his crew. Their apprehension would severely curtail pirate operations in the Federation and on the frontier, and it is the wish of Starfleet Command and the Federation Council that this man be brought to justice.
